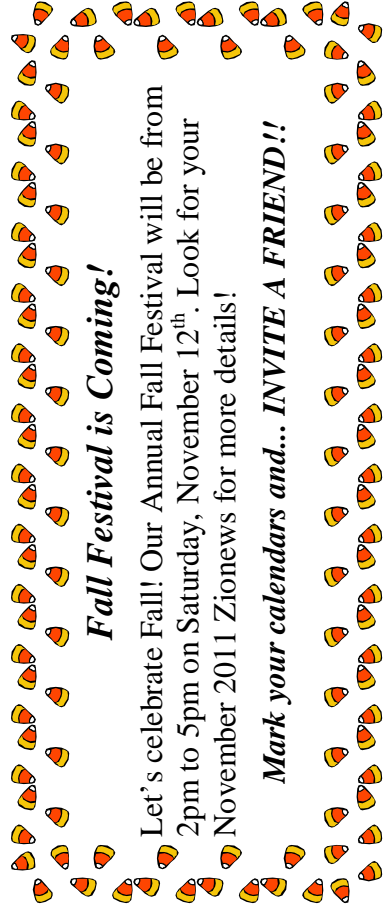

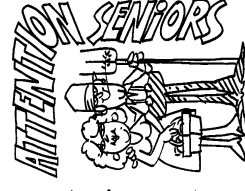
Come Sing in the Christmas Cantata!
